BC Enjoys Summer Enrollment Increase

Bainbridge College experienced a 110% increase in new students enrolled this summer and an overall 17.5% increase in students enrolled during the summer semester.

The increases are compared to the same time period last year.

"We're pleased by the number of students who realize the opportunities available to them by attending an affordable school close to home," commented BC President Clifford Brock.

"Our staff and faculty have worked very hard to recruit new students and maintain the educational standards we strive to

meet."

Brock expects students will take advantage of the upcoming fall preregistration on Monday, July 23 from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. due to the increased demand for fall classes.

"We've hired many new, qualified faculty members who will start this fall and added several new sections of courses to meet the enrollment need."

A revised schedule of fall classes reflecting the new additions in faculty and courses will be available in the BC Admissions Office on Friday, July 13.

In only one year, the Bainbridge College SIFE (Students in Free Enterprise) organization has made an impact on the community and BC.

SIFE encourages students to take what they are learning in the classroom and apply it to real-life situations and to use their knowledge to better their communities through educational outreach projects.

Some of the projects sponsored by the BC SIFE members this past year, with the support of BC administration and faculty and the business community, involved hosting a two-day panel discussion with students from the Academy of Economics in Moscow where they compared the way each economic system worked and how well it contributed to the needs of its people. Another project involved inviting 30 fifth graders from Potter Street Elementary School in Bainbridge to tour Family Bank and learn about the American banking system.

Organization members' efforts haven't gone unnoticed. At the 2001 SIFE Regional Exposition and Career Opportunity Fair in Atlanta, the team earned Rookie of the Year honors and team advi-

sor Dr. Roger Ivey was named a Sam M. Walton Free Enterprise Fellow for SIFE.

Founded in 1975 and active on more than 1000 college campuses in 20 countries, SIFE is a non-profit organization that works in partnership with business and higher education to provide college students an opportunity to make a difference and develop leadership, teamwork, and communication skills through learning, practicing, and teaching the principles of free enterprise.
