The scholarship, presented by Fred Kitchens, Executive Director of the Wine and Spirits Wholesalers of Georgia (WSWG) and sponsored by their foundation, will pay full tuition for a year to Sanchez.

The Bainbridge High School graduate who plans to continue

his studies at either Augusta State University or Georgia State University, is a member of Phi Theta Kappa, Students In Free Enterprise, and a tutor for developmental math, college algebra, and pre-calculus in the Learning Center. He works at Memorial Hospital in Bainbridge.

WSWG's foundation was created in 1964 in memory of industry executive Jerry Kahn and his wife, Gail who perished in a Jacksonville, Florida hotel fire. The

Foundation awards full tuition scholarships to nonresearch universities and colleges of the University System of Georgia on a rotating basis. Schools are selected each year to be representative of every geographical area of the state. All student selections are made by the institutions.

Sanchez is the son of Maria and Salvador Sanchez of Bainbridge.

Reality: Wireless Access For Students at BC
