The goal of the Georgia Driver Education Program is to provide students with the skills, knowledge, motivation & insight needed to become responsible & safe drivers.

What is Joshua's Law? Senate Bill 226, also known as "Joshua's Law", was passed in the 2005 General Assembly. Beginning Jan. 1, 2007, all 16-year-olds applying for a Class D driver's license must complete an approved driver education course and complete a total of 40 hours of supervised driving - 6 hours of which must be at night - with a parent or guardian's sworn verification that these requirements have been met. Any Georgia resident who has not completed an approved driver education course must be at least 17 years old to be eligible for a Class D driver's license. He or she must have completed a total of at least 40 hours of supervised driving, including at least 6 hours at night. The same verification in writing by a parent or guardian is required.

This course teaches the fundamental skills needed to pass the State of Georgia written examination for a Driver's Learning Permit and to meet the requirement for the Class D license. On obtaining the Driver's Learning Permit, participants will have an additional 6 hours of on-the-road training to prepare them for the driving portion of the State of Georgia licensing examination.

What's in it for the parent? A professional driver's education instructor will train your teenager; you maintain your sanity and save you and your spouse endless hours of frustration and anxiety.

What's in it for the teenager? Obtain the Georgia Class D Driver's License or the Learner's Permit.
Note: Enrollment is limited to the first 16 paid registrants. Prerequisite for attendance: Must be 15 years of age or older.
