

Insurance Pre-License Courses

Property & Casualty

This concentrated course, which meets the 40-hour pre-licensing requirements of the State of Georgia, prepares students to take the state examination. A textbook is required and may be purchased from the Continuing Education office.

Limited Sub-Agent Life, Accident & Sickness

Get your career in insurance going by taking this class and going to work! The course meets the 20-hour pre-licensing requirements of the State of Georgia. A textbook, though not required, is recommended, and may be purchased from the Continuing Education office.

Life, Accident & Sickness

This 40-hour course meets the Georgia requirement for classroom instruction for individuals to take the state Life, Accident & Sickness insurance licensing examination. The course will introduce the prospective agent to the laws governing insurance and includes an overview of Georgia rules and regulations. A textbook is required and may be purchased from the Continuing Education office.

Limited Sub-Agent Property & Casualty

Earn while you learn! This short course will provide you with the skills and certification needed to work in an insurance office under the auspices of a licensed property & casualty agent. This course meets the 20-hour pre-licensing requirements of the State of Georgia. A textbook, though not required, is recommended, and may be purchased from the Continuing Education office.
