Registered nurses constitute the largest health care occupation with 2.6 million jobs in 2008. Associate of Science Degree in Nursing

The ADN program requires 5 semesters, including summer, and must be completed within a 3-year period.

PREREQUISITE CORE CLASSES: *These classes require a minimum 2.5 GPA (Grade Point Average) and must be completed before acceptance into the ADN Program:*

ENGL 1101	English Composition I
PSYC 1101	Introduction to General Psychology

Admissions Process for ADN Program

1. Complete the Bainbridge College Admissions Application available from the web at www.bainbridge.edu or the Admissions Office.
2. Successfully complete all degree level required developmental courses, and courses that are prerequisites with a minimum 2.5 grade point average (GPA).
 - A student will NOT be eligible to enter the ADN program if he or she has failed a core class twice within the last 3 years.
 - A student who has failed two or more nursing courses in any nursing program within the last 5 years will NOT be eligible for admission to the ADN program.
3. Pass all parts of the Regents' Exam or meet the exemption criteria before entry into the ADN program.
4. Human Anatomy & Physiology and Microbiology courses taken before program entry must have been taken within 5 years of ADN program entry date with a minimum grade of C for each course.
5. Take TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) within the last 2 years. The scores, which must be submitted with the application to the ADN program, will be used as part of the competitive admissions process. A study guide for TEAS is available on reserve in the Bainbridge College Library. For details, contact BC Testing Center at 229-248-2579 or Early County Center at 229-724-2100.
6. Complete the Application for the Associate Degree in Nursing program, available at www.bainbridge.edu or the ADN office.
7. Participate in an interview on Main Campus.
8. Complete all requirements within specified timeframe upon acceptance to the program.

Admission to the ADN program is a highly competitive process with a limited number of spaces available. Students are chosen from applicants who have completed the application requirements by the established deadline and are based on a point system that includes GPA, preadmission test scores, and the interview.
